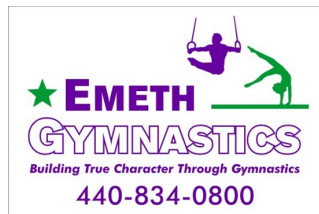

## 2010-2011 Team Policies

### I. Team Tuition and Competition Fee Policies

**A.** Team members are required to have a completed and signed credit card on file at Emeth. It is every team parent's option to pay tuition every month, or choose automatic charge where your credit card on file will be charged on the 5th of every month for your tuition. Team members on automatic charge receive a \$5 discount every month. If you are not on automatic charge, you may only take the \$5 discount if your tuition is received on or before the 5th of the month. Tuition received on the 6th or after is regular price.

**B.** Team members that have not paid tuition in full by the 15th of the month will be contacted, and may choose to either have their unpaid balance charged to their credit card on file or stop coming to practice until another form of payment has been submitted. ***Team members are not permitted to be in practice past the 15th of the month if tuition has not been paid.***

**C.** There are no make-ups for missed team practices. Monthly tuition is not pro-rated for breaks, cancelled practices, or holidays.

**D.** A schedule of competition fees for each level of team is made available prior to the start of their competition season. (Girls team receives this in August, boys team receives this in October) Competition fees are *in addition* to your monthly tuition. These costs are fees that we must pay out for all competition related expenses. Your child's competition fees include all of his or her individual entry fees for meets they are competing in for the season, their portion of team entry fees, and the extra travel expenses that are incurred by coaches traveling to the meets. (Our coaches are reimbursed for their mileage or gas expenses, as appropriate, as well as hotel costs when necessary.) *Note: Emeth Gymnastics pays the coaches hours for when they are coaching at the meet - this is not an additional charge for you.*

**E.** Competition fees are broken into monthly installments. They must be paid on time each month. If they are not paid on time, your child may not be entered into one or more of their competitions. Some of the competitions that we do have entry deadlines that are long before the actual date of the meet. We are very organized and always send our entries in a timely manner to assure our athletes spaces in the competition. Please understand that your child's entry is never sent in unless you are current with your competition fee payments. If you wish to have your competition fees automatically charged to your credit card on file, you must notify the office.

### II. Team Conduct Policies

**A.** Team members and parents are expected to portray respect and positive attitudes towards all Emeth coaches and teammates. If violations of respect or negative talk occur, a meeting will take place between coach and athlete, coach and parent, or coach, athlete and parent to discuss the problems that are occurring, express the standard of conduct that is expected, and find a way to solve the problem. In extreme cases, when respect issues cannot be resolved and are occurring to the detriment of others on the team, an athlete may be removed from the team.

**B.** Team members and parents are expected to have excellent sportsmanship at meets. Please refrain from negative comments about any other gymnast, team, coach, or judge. Encourage everyone!!

**C.** Parents - Our goal in training competitive gymnasts is to build the character qualities of determination, endurance, and self confidence as we strive for excellence in all their skills and routines. We don't want our gymnasts to feel that their value is based only on their score at a meet or whether they placed high enough to win an award. We are very proud of them for working hard at practice and doing their best in competition, even if they make a mistake. Please prepare your athlete for the fact that they may not receive awards at every meet (many competitions only give out awards to the top 50%) and let them know that you are proud of their performance and the good character qualities they are building... not just how they score!

### **III. Practice Policies**

**A.** Please do your very best to attend all practices regularly and be punctual in order to maximize the quality of their training your child receives. Arrangements may be made *if possible* on an individual basis for athletes who must miss practice due to an important **religious commitment**. We make no special arrangements for an athlete who misses practices for any other reasons.

**B.** It is greatly appreciated when you inform us ahead of time when you will be unable to attend practice, and when you will be on vacation. This helps us in our planning!

**C.** We do not pro-rate for missed practices, and there are no "make-ups" for missed practices. If you are going to miss a significant amount of practices in a month and want to be considered for pro-rating, please refer to the attached pro-rating chart and fill out the pro-rating request form. This must be completed and turned in prior to the first of the month in order for you to be considered for pro-rated tuition.

**D. The last team practice before a competition is mandatory.** A team member not present for a mandatory practice will not compete UNLESS a reasonable excuse is provided by a parent ahead of time and approved.

**E. *Mandatory Practice Attire:*** Team girls will purchase a *mandatory practice leotard* in September. Team boys will wear their competition shirt. This mandatory attire must be worn on mandatory practice days. It will not be permitted to be worn to any other practices until the end of the meet season.

**F. *Practice Attire:***

**Girls** must wear a leotard. *If* shorts are worn, they must be fitted gymnastics shorts (such as the GK shorts we sell in our pro shop). Girls training 2-3 days per week may only wear shorts once per week; Girls training 4+ days per week may only wear shorts twice per week. No shorts at mandatory practices, please.

**Boys** must wear a close fitting T-shirt (Under Armor shirts are preferred) and athletic shorts that are not extra long or baggy. No zippers, buckles, buttons, or pockets, please.

**Bags:** All team members are required to have team bags, and bring them to practices and meets. This is where athletes are expected to keep grips, tape, braces, or other personal items needed. You will receive order forms when bag orders are being done, and order through Emeth.

**G. *Girls Hair:*** Girls are expected have their hair put back neatly for every practice, completely out of the eyes. Please use hairspray, clips, or whatever is necessary so that hair *does not come out* for the duration of practice. We expect team girls not to waste their time re-doing hair in the gym.

**H.** FOR PRACTICES THAT ARE 3 HOURS OR LONGER: A 10-15 minute break is given. Please send a

snack or money for your child to purchase a snack for their break. We request that athletes do not share their snacks or drinks. Athletes must sit at the chairs and tables that are provided in the snack area when eating and clean up after themselves when finished.

#### **IV. Joining team or dropping out and returning to team**

**A.** Athletes that have been students in developmental classes at Emeth and who have achieved the skill level needed for an introductory level of team will be invited to join the appropriate level of team between May and July of each year. **Girls team members must be practicing with the team by August 1st, or there will be a three month wait-period from the time they begin practicing until they compete.**

**B.** A previous team member that has left the team and wishes to return, or an athlete who joins our team for the first time and has *not* come through classes at Emeth will receive an evaluation and be assessed for which level they appear to meet requirements for, be assigned a tentative team level and group to train with, and train with them for a 2-4 week trial period to assure that they are training with the appropriate group and level. After this period, we will confirm that this level is appropriate for them, or move them to a more appropriate level.

#### **V. Emeth Gymnastics' Competitive Levels**

Outlined below are the competitive programs that we currently offer:

##### **Boys Team: "Saturns"**

Our competitive boys train year round and compete using the USA Gymnastics Men's Junior Olympic program rules and routines. Their competition season is approximately from January through April.

**Saturn Level 4:** This is the first competitive level for boys gymnastics. These boys train twice per week and compete in the North East Ohio Boys Gymnastics League (NEOBGL). These are AAU sanctioned competitions. There are approximately five competitions per season.

**Saturn Level 5 and up:** As our boys team members progress and advance, they will continue on through Levels 5 and up. These boys train three or more times per week and compete in USAG sanctioned competitions, including USAG State Championships. The boys compete with the USA Junior Olympic Men's Program routines.

##### **Girls Team: "Comets"**

Our competitive girls team trains year round and participates in USAG sanctioned competitions. Their competition season is approximately from November through April, depending upon their level. It is average for girls to spend one or two years in each level, but in some cases an athlete may spend more or less time than that. This is individual to each girl and is based strictly on her achievement of the requirements necessary to advance and the coaches discretion of her readiness. *In most cases*, girls who are ready to advance do so between May and July, after competition season is over. Introductory level competitors who are young in age typically start in Level 3 and advance from there, and introductory level competitors who are older (age 10 and up) typically start in the Bronze I level and advance from that.

**Comet Levels 3-6:** These are the compulsory levels of the competitive girls program, which means all routines are the same in each level. Skill level is progressively more difficult from one level to the next. These levels train between two and four times per week. Girls advance from one level to the next when they have achieved the scores and skills required. These girls compete in 5-8 meets during the season, de-

pending upon their level. The introductory levels compete in close-by competitions, while the more advanced levels also compete in meets that are farther away or out of state. Girls in level 4 and up who have made qualifying scores during the season compete in State Championships at the end of the season.

**Comet Optionals:** (Competitive levels 7 through 10) These girls have individually designed routines that are unique to each athlete. The requirements for difficulty that must be included in each routine get progressively harder as they progress from one optional level to the next. These levels may train three to five times per week, and advance from one level to the next as they achieve the necessary scores and skill requirements. These girls typically compete in about 8 competitions during the year, including some meets out of state. Those with qualifying scores compete in State Championships. Level 8 and higher may advance from State Championships to Regional Championships if a qualifying score is made at State Championships. Levels 9 and 10 may advance to National Championships if they qualify to the Regional Championships at their level and place high enough when competing at Regionals.

**Comet Prep-Optionals:** (Bronze I, Bronze II, Silver, Gold, and Platinum Levels) These are beginner through advanced optional levels of competition for girls who are at least 10 years of age. Routines are uniquely designed for each girl according to her interest and ability. Girls who are competing in levels 4-8 may transfer to a Prep-Optional level and Prep-Optional competitors may also transfer into level 4 or higher whenever they desire, as long as requirements are made. Girls advance from one level to the next as they achieve the necessary score and skill requirements. These levels may train between two and five times per week, depending upon level. These girls compete in 5-8 meets during the season, including out of state meets for the upper levels. Girls in Bronze II and up who make qualifying scores during the season compete in State Championships at the end of the season.

## **VI. Requirements for Level Advancement**

### **A. Score Requirements:**

*Girls Team:* There is no score requirement at the introductory levels of competition (Level 3 and Bronze I) in order to be eligible to move up. All other levels have specific score requirements to be eligible to progress to a higher level, as noted on the advancement chart on the following page.

*Boys Team:* There are no specific score requirements in the boys competitive program.

### **B. Skill Requirements:**

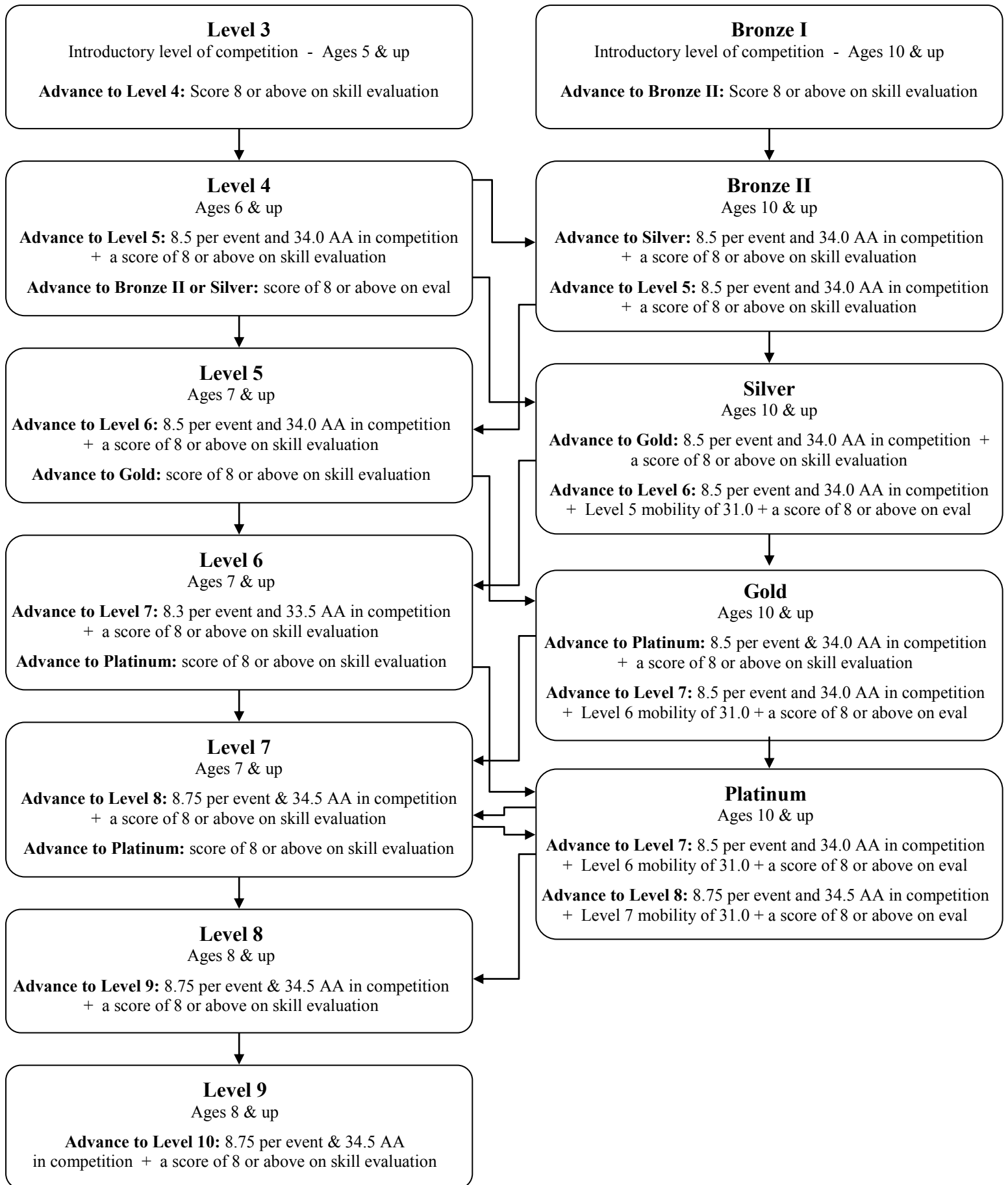
All team members are expected to score an 8 or higher on all of the skills required for the next level to be eligible to move up. Skill evaluations are given by the coaches, and are scored on a scale of 1-10. Thorough evaluations are done for every athlete who is eligible to move up to another level between competitive season. Skill evaluations for moving up are not conducted during competition season except in individual cases that seem necessary according to the coaches discretion and parents' consent.

*Boys Team, Levels 4-6:* In the case that an athlete does not achieve all 8's or above but coaches feel he is mostly ready for the next level, the athlete may have the option of moving up to the next level only to compete in the NEOBGL League. When the athlete has better mastery of all required skills for that level, they may then compete in USAG competition as well.

**C.** Once an athlete meets the requirements to move up, they will be invited to do so. An athlete is never *required* to move up - they may stay in their current level as long as they wish.

Below is a chart of our competitive girls' levels, requirements for advancing from level to level, and the direction of progression from one level to the next.



## VII. Choreography for Optional and Prep-Optional Comets

**A.** Girls in Levels 7-10 and Prep-Optional Levels Bronze II and above are required to have their own beam and floor routines choreographed. Beam routines are typically choreographed during practice, and there is no extra charge. Floor routines are choreographed and learned outside of practice.

**B.** Floor music must be purchased. For Levels 7-10, Gold, and Platinum the cost is \$50. For Bronze II and Silver, floor music is between \$20 and \$50, depending on what you choose. (This is the actual cost of music purchased from companies that specialize in composing music specifically for gymnastics. You may find and order it yourself, or pay Emeth and have us order it for you - we charge no extra fee to order it).

**C.** Choreography charge: \$100 for Level 7-10, Gold, and Platinum; \$60 for Bronze II and Silver Levels. This includes a private lesson between one and 1-1/2 hours where you learn the routine.

**D.** Once you have floor music and choreography, you may keep it for as many years as you like, even when you advance to another level. We will adjust the difficulty level within your routine to fit the new requirements of the next level. It is always your option to get a new routine, but it must be done during the off season. We recommend you keep your routine for approximately two years, but it is your choice.

## VIII. Competition Apparel

**A.** Competition apparel is ordered on August 1st for girls team and October 1st for boys team. At times when leotards or warm-ups are scheduled to be the same as the prior year, we facilitate a used competition apparel sale prior to the order dates to allow team members the opportunity to buy used team apparel at half price from other team members who have grown out of theirs!

**B.** Team Athletes must come to competitions dressed as follows:

**Boys:** Team competition uniform (shirt, shorts, pants, and jacket) and a neat haircut.

**Girls:** Competition leotard and team warm-ups. *If* wearing a bra and/or underwear, we require that it is the appropriate GK bra ordered through us that will fit under the leotard neatly and remain unseen - this is to avoid deductions that are taken from your score for undergarments showing. Hair **MUST** be put back neatly and securely with **NO** hair hanging over the eyes or around the face. Hairspray is recommended. Glitter *is* permitted. All nail polish must be removed from fingers and toes.

**Everyone:** Temporary tattoos must be removed and real tattoos must be covered. Jewelry is not allowed to be worn, except for *one stud earring* in each ear.

**C. AWARDS:** Many times coaches are unable to attend the awards ceremony because they are busy with another session of team girls who are competing, but we ask that our athletes represent Emeth in a professional manner. Please wear your full competition uniform (jackets zipped up!) when you stand up for awards (Girls - no leotard sleeves hanging out of your jacket!), cheer for your teammates, be polite to other teams, and avoid any negative expressions or words, or any display of bad sportsmanship.

## **IX. Talent Opportunity Program availability for girls team ages 11 & under**

TOP stands for Talent Opportunity Program, which is a nationally recognized program designed by USA Gymnastics specifically for athletes that show exceptional potential in our sport in the areas of strength, flexibility, good form, and technique. The program is meant to take these girls at a young age and provide them with **intense** training in all of these areas that will significantly increase their rate of progress in the sport. The TOPS program provides increased strength, confidence, and precision for all its participants. It also requires a very intense level of physical stamina for the athletes and a high level of commitment both on the part of the athlete and the athlete's family.

At Emeth we are going into our fourth year of running a TOP program. We began with several young athletes three years ago who were willing to make the commitment to try the program. Since then, the TOP program has grown a little bit each year and our coaches have attended clinics and training focused on TOP training. We are extremely pleased with the results of the program for our participants up to this point, and have seen it make a dramatic difference in their rate of progress and quality of gymnastics. As we continue to work towards patterning our program after some of the most successful elite programs in this country, this season we are making several changes to the schedule. We will be opening up TOP participation to any of our girls' team athletes who wish to make the commitment to be a part of it. We are also formatting our TOP program to push these athletes toward reaching a higher set of standards. The intensity of this year's program will continue to be very high - and will require consistent dedication from all of its participants.

TOP practices are *in addition* to an athletes regular team practices for their level. Participants must commit to one of two practice options:

Option 1: Saturday mornings, 7:00-9:00 am

Option 2: Saturday mornings, 7:00-9:00 am & Tuesday mornings, 6:00-8:00 am

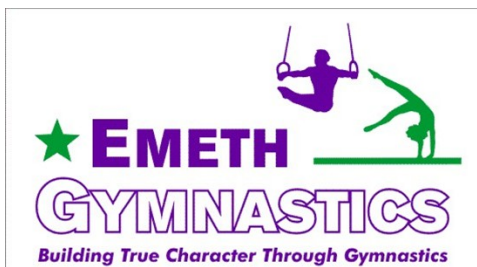
